

## THOS. ENGLISH DIED IN FIELD

Neighbors were shocked on Monday evening when it was learned that Thomas English had been found lying dead in a field on his farm and from the evidence available it is believed he had been dead since Friday. A neighbor noticed Mr. English's team of horses loose, with broken harness on them, and on going to investigate found the body. The deceased had been plowing and went to fix a fence when he was seized with a fatal heart attack.

Dr. Eagleson, coroner, of Madoc, and Provincial Officer Dymond, of Madoc, were called and after investigation decided an inquest was unnecessary. The remains were interred in Fox's cemetery Monday night owing to the condition of the body, and on Tuesday forenoon Rev. C. W. Hillingsworth, pastor of St. Andrew's and Zion United Churches, conducted a service at the residence of the deceased and at the graveside.

The late Thomas English was in his 76th year and since the death of his sister, Miss Rebecca English, he had been living alone. For quite a number of years he was a resident of the village and he was widely known throughout this part of the County.

When her health permitted she was a regular attendant at the Methodist church, and was an active and valued member of the Ladies' Aid Society.
