or three years, thus retaining the cup), Alex Johnston (1935 to 1950), and Chas. Brownson.

The factory was closed at the end of the season in 1950. In the spring of 1951 the property was sold to Mr. Scott who used the plant for a short time to bottle soft drinks. The property changed hands a couple of times since and the factory finally was torn down.

It has been generally admitted a better location could not have been secured. The factory was beautifully situated on a well-irrigated piece of land, a very essential requirement for a factory. The building presented a picturesque view both from the main travelled road and the waters of the bay. Its sanitary conditions and equipment were unequalled and was classed as second to none in the province.

POINT PETRE CHEESE FACTORY

It is not known when the Point Petre cheese factory was built, but the factory was situated on the Don Cole farm on the cross-road which leads from Point Petre to the road on the south side of East Lake.

From information received, Miss Brennan was the cheese-maker. Miss Brennan later married John Wesley McConnell, and they made their home at Point Petre. At that time they manufactured only soft cheese.

ROYAL STREET CHEESE FACTORY

The Royal Street Cheese Factory was built in the early 1870s by Isaac Striker on his farm on Royal Street, privately owned. The first factory was built just west of where the current factory is situated. Albert Waghorn, Hamilton Striker and George McConnell were makers.

The factory operated a few years and finally was destroyed by fire. Eleven days after the fire a new factory was built and operations resumed. George McConnell commenced making cheese for Isaac Striker in 1879 and continued until Mr. Striker died in
