**MRS. JOHN LEGROW**

A former resident of Marmora passed away at her home in Halleybury on June 11th, in the person of Mrs. John Lagrow. Mrs. Lagrow, who was formerly Mary Demass, was in her 91st year, having been born in Marmora on January 2nd, 1857.

In 1909 the family moved to Casey Township, Northern Ontario, where they resided until two years ago when Mrs. Lagrow and her family moved to Halleybury. Her husband predeceased her about six years ago.

She is survived by four sons and two daughters: Jerry, at home; John, of Duparquet, Quebec; Thomas, of Toronto; William, of New Liskeard; Mrs. Henry Jackson (Marguerite), of Harley Township and Mrs. William McIntyre (Catharine) of Halleybury, with whom the deceased lady made her home. Another daughter passed away eleven years ago, Mrs. Henry Bertrand (Mary) of New Liskeard. Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Joseph Kirkey, of New Liskeard and Mrs. Peters, of Storthooks, Sask., and one brother Michael, of Storthooks.

A long line of descendents also survive her including 54 grand children; 70 great grand children and 5 great great grand children.

**FORMER HASTINGS COUPLE  
MARRIED 65 YEARS**

New Liskeard, May 17—Married in Hastings County, nearly sixty-five years ago, Mr. and Mrs. John Legrow of Casey Township, fourteen miles from town, have more than 100 living descendants, and they are believed to hold the distinction of being the longest wed couple in the Temiskaming District. Six of their seven children are living, and they have fifty-five grandchildren and forty-two great-grandchildren.

In good health, except for Mrs. Legrow's eyesight, the elderly couple come of farming stock, and they have lived all their lives on the land. Mr. Legrow is in his eighty-sixth year and his wife, the former Mary Demas, celebrated her eighty-third birthday in January. They have lived in Northern Ontario since 1909 when they moved up from their former farm near Marmora, and they settled in Casey Township twenty-six years ago, carving a home out of the solid bush to duplicate an experience in their early married life in Southern Ontario.

Today, they live on a horseless farm, a tractor constructed at home from an old truck purchased for \$75 doing the work formerly requiring equine aid. Twice since settling in Casey Township has their home been threatened by raging bush fires, but in 1916 and again six years later the flames destroyed property all around them, but left untouched their buildings on the banks of Wright Creek, tributary of the Blanche River. Mr. Legrow helped install the plant of the first daily newspaper in Cobalt.

Born in Three Rivers, P.Q., Mr. Legrow moved to Marmora in early life. His wife is a native of Hastings County, and although of French descent, cannot speak a word of that language. The couple were married in the Roman Catholic Church at Marmora on October 3, 1875, by Rev. Father Davis, their attendants being Catherine Darragh, the bride's cousin, and Jerry Legrow brother of the bridegroom. One son Thomas, lives in Toronto; other members of the family are in different parts of the North.

### THOMAS LAGROW

An aged and highly esteemed citizen of Marmora passed away in Belleville last Friday at the advanced age of 84 years in the person of Thomas Lagrow. He was born in Stirling and as a young man was a farm laborer, having worked on some of the best farms in that district. He came to Marmora when the late Gordon McWilliams owned and managed the Royal Hotel and took charge of the stables when that was an important part of the hotel business. Later he was in the employ of the Pearce Company Ltd, for a long period.

The late Thomas Lagrow was a faithful worker and a competent gardener. Quiet and unassuming he was friendly and obliging and had a large number of friends. He was fond of reading until recent years when his eyesight became impaired.

He was married to Kate McGarvey, who predeceased him about six years ago. He is survived by two brothers, Levi Lagrow, of Belleville, and Joseph, Toronto; and three sisters, Mrs. W. Phillips, Havelock; Mrs. Charles Mitchell, Stirling; and Mrs. Wm. Darrah, Marmora. The youngest member of the family is about 74 years of age, while Levi is 86 years of age.

The funeral was held on Sunday afternoon. Service was conducted at the home of deceased's sister-in-law, Mrs. W. R. Gray, by Rural Dean A. B. Caldwell. St. Paul's choir was in attendance, with Mrs. L. R. Rundle at the organ, and led in the singing of "Rock of Ages" and "Abide With Me."

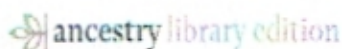

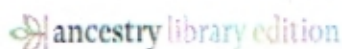

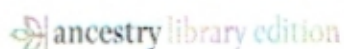
