

Skaters keep it on ice

It's been a long time since Don Jackson amazed an audience with a triple lutz, but he is still inspiring skaters with his expertise.

Jackson was the 1962 World Figure Skating champion when he proved himself "king of the blades" at the Prague world championships. He was the first person to do a triple lutz jump and it was 12 years before anyone did it again. Today, Jackson, 57, teaches youngsters at the Minto Skating Club in Ottawa. He accompanied 65 of his members to the Eastern Ontario Sectional Championships held at the Quinte Sports Centre in Belleville on November 8.

He took time to talk to other young skaters, offering encouragement and advice. One person who appreciated meeting the king of blades was Stefanie Partridge, 17, from Marmora. She currently lives in Gloucester near her coach so she can gain valuable training at a larger centre where there is more ice time.

Stefanie was second at the skating nationals at the junior level last February in Vancouver. She participated in the international competition in Germany three weeks ago where she injured her leg.

"I was supposed to go to Slovak for the junior championship last week," she said. "I am not sure how long I will be off now."

Stefanie chatted with Don Jackson about how training has changed over the years. They both agreed it was better when new skaters had to "do figures" which gave them valuable practice.

"There were less injuries then," Jackson said. "You need to build up the basics first." He said competitions give skaters the opportunity to see the best in the area. This year the first juvenile and pre-novice nationals will be held in Toronto in February. Skaters advance from sectionals to divisionals, then nationals and world championships.

At the Eastern Ontario Championship Sectionals held in Belleville on November 8 there were about 350 skaters from eastern Ontario. The event was sponsored by the Bank of Montreal and hosted by the Quinte Figure Skating Club. Erin Smith from Stittsville won the juvenile ladies, Justin O'Shaugnessy from Quinte won the juvenile men's, Siobhan Karam and Joshua McGrath from Minto club won the juvenile dance.



Nikki Finch placed fifth in Pre-Novice Ladies Flight 1 at the Eastern Ontario Sectionals in Ottawa on Nov. 7.




