Erica Downes competed in the Bank of Montreal Sectional Championships held in Kingston, Ontario November 9-11, 2000. In the qualifying round of the Novice La-

evetn, she placed second which secured her a spot in the final.

There were 16 skaters in the final. In the short program portion of the final competition,

Erica placed a disappointing 10th. The short program is worth one third of the total mark and the long-program counts for two thirds. Erica skated the long program with She landed determination. two double axels and a triple toe loop which helped her to a second place finish in the long program. The combined results placed her fourth and won her a place on the Eastern Ontario Team. At age 12, Erica was the youngest competitor in the event.

Erica will compete at the Eastern Canadian Qualifier in Ottawa from December 6-9. Thirty-two will compete in this Novice Ladies event. These competitors will be the top four winners of their Provincial Sectionals (Central Ontario, Eastern Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick Nova Scotia, Prince Edward

Island and Newfoundland).

Erica's goal will be to finish in the top eleven at this competition in order to compete at the Junior Nationals which will be held in Kitchener,

# Local skater has sights set on Sydney

Marmora and Lake - Erica Downes, a Grade 8 student at Marmora Senior School and a member of the Marmora Skating Club, skated to a second-place finish in both the long and short program events of the Autumn Skate Invitational held recently in Ottawa. In August she competed at the Thornhill Summer Skate where she finished third in the short program and first in the long

program. She is currently practising for her next competition which takes place in Kingston on October 13. These competitions are leading up to the sectional qualifying event to be held November 8 through 11 in Ottawa. Her present goal is to qualify for the Eastern Challenge event being held in Sydney, Nova Scotia, in November and following that, the Junior Nationals in St. John's, Newfoundland, in January of next year.

This enthusiastic 13-year-old has been on the ice since the age of two and can be found training five evenings a week, either in Marmora or Stirling. She admits that skating is, "just getting interesting now, because I get to go places," and gives as an example the fact


