HENRY AUGUSTINE McNALLY

A well known and highly respected resident of Marmora passed away on Sunday, July 26th, in the person of Henry Augustine McNally. He was in his 67th year and had been in failing health for about four years. He died in St. Joseph's Hospital Peterborough.

The late Mr. McNally was born at Westport, Ontario, a son of the late William Henry McNally and his wife the former Mary Agnes O'Donoghue. His early life was spent in eastern Ontario and he attended Queen's University, graduating in 1914 as a Metallurgical Engineer.

As a young man he came to Deloro where he entered the employ of the Deloro Smelting & Refining Co. Limited. For many years he was superintendent of the Silver Plant and he won the respect of his employers and the employees with whom he worked.

He was married to Beatrice Bertrand, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Stanis Bertrand of Marmora, and they resided at Deloro until a few years ago when they moved to Marmora Village.

Mr. McNally was a member of the Sacred Heart Church at Marmora and of the Holy Name Society and he took an active interest in affairs of the Church and Community while his health permitted.

He is survived by his wife; two daughters, Mrs. Gregory Rotter (Isobel), of Buffalo, N. Y.; Miss Jane McNally of Toronto; two sons, Dr. Thomas of Trenton and Bernard at home, and one grandson, Thos, Jr. There is also one sister Miss Hilda McNally of Westport and three brothers F. W. McNally, North Bay and Christopher and Leonard of Detroit. A daughter and two brothers predeceased him.

The funeral was held on Wednesday morning, proceeding from the Howden Funeral Home, Marmora, to Sacred Heart church where Requiem Mass was sung by Rev W. P. Healey, P.P. Interment was in Sacred Heart Cemetery.
