There also survive his father, Mr. James A. Daly; one brother, Bernard, of town ; and one sister, Mrs. Leonard Dixon, of New Ontario.

The funeral took place on Tuesday morning and was under military auspices. Members of the local company, and returned soldiers, under command of Major J. M. Bygott, Capt. T E. Hyland and Lieut. H. B.
