

# Descendants of Francis PLEW

## Generation No. 1

1. FRANCIS<sup>1</sup> PLEW was born 1818. He married HARRIET ?.

### Notes for FRANCIS PLEW:

Francis is reputed to have come from Quebec, but that, while suspected as true, has never formally been confirmed. He spelled his name PLEW, but if he did come from Quebec it is interesting to note that no census for those areas of Quebec in question (Sorel and environs, Yamaska and environs, Trois-Rivieres and environs, and Cap-de-la-Madeleine and environs) shows a surname as PLEW (or indeed PLUE for that matter). But there are many families by the name of PLEAU. Thus it is suspected that Francis lived in Quebec as Francis Pleau, then came to the Actinolite, Ontario area under an anglicized version as Francis Plew.

### Notes for HARRIET ?:

The newspaper obituary reads as follows:

"LATE MRS. HARRIET PLUE

Tuesday morning, February 19th death came to the hamlet of Actinolite and called from the scene of her earthly labours, Mrs. Harriet Plue, who was perhaps the oldest resident of that community. She was in her ninety first year.

Deceased had enjoyed good health up to last three or four weeks.

Mrs. Plue was a very kind-hearted woman, a good neighbour and a faithful and loving mother.

She is survived by one daughter Mrs. J. Lapalm and two sons, viz. Joseph and Hugh both of Actinolite."

(The identity of the newspaper was not available, nor identified on the clipping).

### Notes for JOSEPH FRANCIS PLEW:

For some years Joseph served as a trustee of the Kleinstuber School. One document reads as follows:

" Bridgewater Dec. 16 - 1889

To the Municiple Council of Elzevir S.S.

Please pay Henry Kleinstuber Treasurer of S.S #6 the sum which is requested for School purposes and Oblige.

The spelling of the surname by census enumerators prior to about 1900 was PLEW. Even so, the gravestone markers for those formerly recorded as PLEW show PLUE.

Notes for CATHARINE ("TATTIE") MCDONALD:

"Tattie" as she was known had Ed Nolan build her a little house behind the Nolan home on the Flinton Road. Records for this family show a moving back and forth between the spellings as 'MacDonald' and 'McDonald'. Clearly they were used interchangeably. In fact, the tombstone notation for Tattie is 'MacDonald', which, if correct, gives me also a Scottish heritage, as well as French and Irish.

Notes for STANLEY E. PLUE:

Stanley travelled to Watertown, New York as a young man and was, at that time engaged to Rachel Courneyea. He contracted typhoid fever there and died. His body was shipped by train back to Stoco, Ontario for burial. Shortly afterwards, his brother Harlan became engaged to and eventually married Rachel. He is buried at the old Sacred Heart of Mary Historical Catholic Cemetery, Madoc, Ontario.

His funeral to the Sacred Heart Church on Monday morning was largely attended. Requiem High Mass was offered by Rev. J.P. O'Riordan, afterwards his remains were interred in the Sacred Heart Cemetery. He leaves to mourn his loss three brothers, John of Tweed, William, Port Colborne, Earl, Rochester, N.Y., and one sister, Rev. M. Cosmas, Smith's Falls. May his soul rest in peace.

Verna would have been 24 years of age when Joseph LaPalm died, and 37 years of age when her aunt Hattie died.

7. FRANCIS JOSEPH<sup>3</sup> PLUE (*JOSEPH FRANCIS<sup>2</sup> PLEW, FRANCIS<sup>1</sup>*) was born September 02, 1878 in Actinolite, Ontario, and died 1953 in Codrington Ontario. He met BRIDGET (ADELIA)(DELIA) COURNEYEA in Actinolite, Ontario, daughter of PAUL COURNOYER and CLARISSE VALOIS.

Notes for FRANCIS JOSEPH PLUE:

Frank grew up in Hastings County, residing in a number of locations through the years including Actinolite, Queensborough, Bay City, Michigan, and near Stoco. His farm in Elzevir township was located just north of what is now Highway 7 and east of Highway 37 - on the Flinton Road and bordering the Scootamata River to the south. When one sees the former location one wonders how they ever eked out an existence.

In the winter time when his family was still very young he would travel well north of Tweed into the lumber camps where he would stay and work until spring. Delia looked after the children.

At one time Frank owned the piece of land that once housed a small restaurant beside which were enclosed a couple of black bears, which I well remember as a youngster. He sold that parcel of land to the owners of the store which was located right on Highway 7 at Highway 37. The new owners, Reverend Major Merritt Price opened "The Log Cabin" restaurant in 1932, the first service station between Madoc and Perth on Highway #7. Frank's relatives apparently came from Quebec, although Frank himself was born in Elzevir Township. The Plue's were among the earliest white settlers in the area of The German Settlement, owning land on Concession 5, Lots 3 and 10, Concession 6, Lot 5, and Concession 9, Lots 16 and 21

Later Frank moved his family to a 200 acre farm (at least half of it bush) near Orland, Ontario, where he worked it until he retired, turning it over to Adrian. Frank and Delia retired to the village of Orland along with his son Jimmy and his daughter Marie. He and Delia lived there for the rest of their lives.

Frank maintained that PLUE was not the original spelling of the family name. He said it was PLEAU, and it had originated in Quebec. At one time he tried to convince the family to change it back, but he was unsuccessful in convincing them it was a good idea.

Notes for BRIDGET (ADELIA)(DELIA) COURNEYEA:

Delia, as Bridget was more familiarly known, was the first one (apparently) to change the spelling of her surname from Cournoyer to Courneyea. She became deaf for the latter number of years of her life, basically for all those years I as her grandson knew her. Her siblings also used the same spelling of the surname, but tombstone entries reflect several versions of the spelling used by Delia.

Delia and her family were blessed with an exceedingly strong faith. I remember my father, Adrian (Delia's son) telling about a time when one of their close relatives was very ill, and had been so for several days. One evening quite late, and just before the family retired for the night, there were three heavy loud bangs on the front door. Delia picked up a candle and went to the door. When she opened it she saw a coffin on the front steps. She blessed herself, shut the door, said a little prayer, and three days later the ill relative died - just as this premonition had apparently indicated.

Her funeral Mass at St. Alphonsus Church, Wooler was said by Rev. J. Walsh. Rev. J. Sullivan was present in the sanctuary and assisted at the gravesite. The Mass was served by grandsons Ronald and John Plue, and Paul and Francis Houlihan. Pallbearers were Robert Hazelwood, William and Frank Moran, William Cowan, Raymond Kemp, and Jack Mound.

For most of the years that I knew her, she suffered gradually worsening arthritis which eventually left her greatly deformed and in constant pain - although I never heard her ever complain.
