KILLED BY FALLING TREE

Mr. Emmory Bedore Victim of Fatal
Accident Last Friday Afternoon.

Mr. Emmory Bedore, who resided near the fairgrounds, just outside the limits of the village, met with a fatal accident while at work for Mr. John Crawford last Friday afternoon. In company with Mr. Gordon Gray he was cutting timber for Marmora Coöperage Company. They cut one tree down and it fell against another evidently breaking off a limb which was held up by other branches. Mr. Bedore then began to cut down the tree which was holding up the one they had just cut. Without warning the limb, which had been broken off, fell striking the deceased on the top of his head. The limb was about 16ft long and four inches thick at the bottom, and fell about thirty feet with great force.

Medical assistance was immediately summoned and as soon as possible the victim was removed to his home here, but although everything possible was done he never rallied, and passed away Saturday night.

The late Emmory Bedore was born on the old homestead in Marmora township, not far from the village and has lived all his life in this vicinity. His father died at his home in the village just ten days before. Deceased leaves a wife but no family, except an adopted daughter.

He is also survived by four brothers and four sisters all of whom reside in the village or in Marmora township. They are Alex. Julian, Frank and George, Mrs. Robt. Forsythe, Mrs. Thos. Winfield, Mrs. John Ryan and Miss Polly.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon, service being conducted in the Methodist Church by the Rev. W. H. Clarke and interment taking place in Marmora cemetery.

DEATH OF MICHAEL BEDORE

The oldest resident of Marmora and one of the oldest men in the county passed away on Wednesday morning in the person of Mr. Michael Bedore. Deceased was in his ninety-sixth year. He was born in the province of Quebec but has been a resident of this vicinity for over half a century. He was a farmer for many years and was respected by all who knew him. His wife predeceased him quite a number of years ago. He is survived by four sons and three daughters, who reside in Marmora village or township. They are as follows;—Alex., Julian, Frank and Eumory. Mrs. Robt. Forsythe, Mrs. Thos. Winfield and Miss Polly, who has kept house for her father for some years.

The funeral will take place on Friday morning, service being conducted in the R. C. Church by Father Murtagh.

Alex Bedore Died Suddenly

Alexander Bedore, an elderly farmer of Marmora township was found dead on the road leading to his home about six miles from this village late Monday afternoon.

Death was due to heart failure. Mr. Bedore was a widower in his eighty-first year living on the Marmora-Cordova road about two miles from Cordova. His body, still warm, was found by Eva and George Hamilton, children of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Hamilton.

Mr. Hamilton had been working recently on the Bedore farm. The deceased owned a number of stock, including cattle and pigs. He had set out in the morning to search for a missing pig, and had dinner at Thos. Winfield's home, remaining several hours in the afternoon apparently in ordinary health and good spirits. In the morning Mr. Bedore had helped Mr. Winfield extricate a colt from a muddy part of the pasture. The Hamilton children had offered to help find the stray pig, and about 5.30 o'clock when they were driving it towards the Bedore farm and were about three hundred yards from the house they found their aged neighbour dead on the roadside.

The road leading to Mr. Bedore's home is rather hilly, and it is thought that his exertions at Winfield's in the morning proved too heavy a strain on his heart especially on the hilly part of the road.

The children notified Mr. Winfield, and Constable Gillen of Marmora was called. Dr. H. Alger of Stirling was also summoned and gave permission to remove the body. Provincial Constable Gray of Marmora, returning later from duty elsewhere in the county, also investigated the circumstances of Mr. Bedore's death, and it was decided that an inquest was not necessary. The body was taken to the home of Mr. Bedore's sister, Mrs. Polly McDonald, in Marmora.

Grand Old Man Of Hastings

Buried In Marmora Cemetery

Funeral service for Julius Bedore, who died at Belleville General Hospital on Wednesday, June 3, was held at St. Paul's Anglican Church on Saturday, June 6 at 1:30 p.m. Rev. John Lombard officiated.

Mr. Bedore, whose life span is almost a personal parallel to Canada's nationalhood, died at the age of 104.

He had been in good health until a short time ago, and was affectionately known as the "Grand Old Man of Hastings Minor", where he had spent his latter years.

Born and educated in Marmora Township when it was a pioneering settlement, son of the late Michael Bedore and Therine Terrion, he was one year younger than Canada itself.

When he was born the British Empire had still to reach its zenith, the West was awaiting settlement and the last spike in the Canadian Pacific Railway could be driven 17 years later. As a centurian he saw many inventions that changed man's lifestyle, - aircraft, radio, the automobile, telephone, commercial electricity. At 101 he watch-

ed the first man walk on the moon and said "it was one of the most wonderful things that ever happened."

A sawyer by trade, Mr. Bedore worked for many years for the Pearce Lumber Co. and the G. B. Airhart and Son Lumber Company of this area.

One of eleven children, Mr. Julius Bedore was the last surviving member of a long-living family. His father, Michael, who came to this area from Quebec and was Marmora's first shoemaker, died at the age of 96. Three other sons, Alex, George and Frank, died at ages 81, 88 and 99 and two daughters lived to be 95.

His wife, the former Lillian Jones, and only son Wilbert, predeceased him.

He is survived by seven daughters, Mrs. S. C. Boyd (Margaret) of Belleville, Mrs. J. Barradell, (Claire) Florida, Mrs. J. Gordon (Mamie), Florida, Mrs. F. Feeney, (Ellien), Vancouver, Mrs. R. J. Brophy, (Muriel), Montreal, Mrs. J. Berg (Mildred), Bermuda and Mrs. C. Watson (Merrell) of Stirling.

Mr. Bedore also leaves 21 grandchildren and 65 great-grandchildren and 18 great-great grandchildren. His descendants total 105 - one for each year he lived.

Entombment took place in Marmora Protestant Cemetery vault. Arrangements were by the Howden Funeral Home, Marmora.

Bearers were eight grandsons: Barry Watson, Kenneth Corner, Charles, Don and Robert Brophy, Fred Blampied, Eric Bedore and Cliff Arquin.
